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#### Updates to Triennial HSP

#### Adjustments to Countermeasure Strategies for Programming funds:

With the Triennial Highway Safety Plan (3HSP) established in FY24, there are minor adjustments to countermeasures strategies for programming funds listed below:

#### Program Area: Racial Profiling Data Collection, Section 1906 Description of Highway Safety Problems

In the State of Arizona, the term "racial profiling" refers to the use by law enforcement personnel, an individual's race or ethnicity as a factor in articulating reasonable suspicion to stop, question or arrest an individual (unless race or ethnicity is part of an identifying description of a specific suspect for a specific crime. In January 2003, the Arizona Department of Public Safety (AZ DPS) began voluntarily collecting data regarding traffic and pedestrian stops. Although data collection was voluntarily initiated by DPS, as part of a 2006 settlement agreement, DPS agreed to conduct a comprehensive evaluation of traffic stop data collected by officers. The University of Cincinnati research team was awarded a three-year contract to conduct the departments' "Traffic Stop Data Analysis Study".

In November 2007, as a result of the Year 1 analysis, the University of Cincinnati provided recommendations to DPS to help further their analysis. As a result of the recommendations DPS has voluntarily began the process of enhancing its data collection. DPS is in the process of collecting new data above and beyond what was required by the agreement. In addition to the new data fields, DPS is in the process of developing a procedure to collect the data electronically. By collecting the data electronically, DPS will be able to eliminate errors associated with the use of scanners currently being used to compile the data received from officers in the field. This clean data will allow the University of Cincinnati research group to do a better analysis of the data provided to them.

#### **Countermeasure Strategies in Program Area**

#### **Countermeasure Strategy**

NHTSA Uniform Guidelines for highway safety programs #15: Traffic Enforcement Services: Each State, in cooperation with its political subdivisions, tribal governments, and other parties as appropriate, should develop and implement a comprehensive highway safety program, reflective of State demographics, to achieve a significant reduction in traffic crashes, fatalities, and injuries on public roads. The highway safety program should include a traffic enforcement services program designed to enforce traffic laws and regulations; reduce traffic-crashes and resulting fatalities and injuries; provide aid and comfort to the injured; investigate and report specific details and causes of traffic crashes; supervise traffic crash and highway incident clean-up; and maintain safe and orderly movement of traffic along the highway system.

#### Countermeasure Strategy: Racial Profiling Data Collection and Analysis

Program Area: Racial Profiling Data Collection, Section 1906

#### **Countermeasure and justification**

Accurate state traffic record data plays a crucial role in effective safety programming, operational management, and strategic planning. Each state must maintain a traffic records system that facilitates data-driven decision-making, allowing for the identification of issues, development and evaluation of countermeasures, and efficient resource allocation.

To qualify for a state traffic safety information system improvements grant under 23 U.S.C. §405(c), federal statute mandates that states certify they have conducted or updated an assessment of their highway safety data and traffic records system within the past five years. According to NHTSA regulations in 23 C.F.R. §1300.22(b)(4), this assessment must adhere to specified procedures and methodologies outlined in the advisory.

The document offers guidance on three assessment processes, allowing states to select the most suitable approach for their requirements. The Traffic Records Program Assessment Advisory provides optional recommendations and outlines the characteristics of an exemplary traffic records system that states can use to evaluate their capabilities. Similar to the 2012 edition, this updated advisory emphasizes the components, functionalities, and data integrity necessary for an efficient traffic records system that supports informed decision-making and facilitates cost-effective enhancements in highway and traffic safety.

States stand to benefit by aligning with the criteria outlined for an ideal traffic records system, ensuring the collection, analysis, and timely availability of complete and accurate traffic safety data. This alignment is crucial for identifying traffic safety issues, developing effective countermeasures, and ultimately reducing injuries and fatalities resulting from crashes.

Traffic Enforcement Services is informed by the uniform guidelines #15 issued in accordance with 23 U.S.C. 402(a)(2). This guideline served as a framework for identifying effective countermeasures based on evidence-based research and best practices. By aligning the countermeasure strategy with the uniform guidelines and drawing on the insights from NHTSA-facilitated programmatic assessments, GOHS ensures that its approach is well-informed, evidence-based, and in compliance with federal regulations. This collaboration with federal guidelines and assessments strengthens the overall effectiveness and impact of the state's traffic safety initiatives.

• Highway Safety Program Guideline 15: Traffic Enforcement Services requires each State, in cooperation with its political subdivisions, tribal governments, and other parties as appropriate, should develop and implement a comprehensive highway safety program, reflective of State demographics, to achieve a significant reduction in traffic crashes, fatalities, and injuries on public roads. The highway safety program should include a traffic enforcement services program designed to enforce traffic laws and regulations; reduce traffic-crashes and resulting fatalities and injuries; provide aid and comfort to the injured; investigate and report specific details and causes of traffic crashes; supervise traffic crash and highway incident clean-up; and maintain safe and orderly movement of traffic along the highway system.

When determining which projects to fund for implementing the countermeasure strategy, GOHS will consider several key factors. These considerations will include 1) Public Engagement to gather community input and understand their concerns regarding traffic safety. This will help GOHS identify specific needs and priorities of the community being served and ensure funded projects align with their expectations; 2) Traffic Safety data to analyze crash data, traffic volume, and historical trends, identify high-risk areas,

prevalent traffic violations, and patterns of unsafe behaviors. This data-driven approach will help prioritize projects based on the severity and frequency of incidents; 3) Directly affected communities impacted by traffic safety issues. Understanding the unique challenges different communities face will guide the countermeasure strategy; 4) Areas such as intersections, highways, or neighborhoods that experience a higher volume of accidents or unsafe behaviors. By focusing on these locations, GOHS can strategically allocate resources to address the most critical areas; and 5) Solicitation of Proposals from relevant stakeholders, including government agencies, nonprofit organizations, and community groups will encourage diverse project ideas, innovation, and collaboration in addressing traffic safety concerns.

These factors will guide GOHS to make informed decisions about funding projects that effectively address the identified traffic safety issues and positively impact the affected communities. This data-driven approach shows a dedication to making Arizona's roads safer.

#### Changes to performance plan:

With the Triennial Highway Safety Plan (3HSP) being established in FY24, GOHS set a 5-year rolling average targets for C-1 Core Performance Measure (Number of Traffic Fatalities), C-2 Core Performance Measure (Number of serious injuries) and C-3 Core Performance Measure (Fatalities/VMT.)

#### The C-1 Core Performance Outcome Measure

Number of Traffic Fatalities – GOHS set a 5-year rolling year target at 1267.4. Based on the State 5-year rolling average actuals for 2019-2023, Number of Traffic Fatalities was 1,171.0. The projected target is on track to meet.

#### The C-2 Core Performance Outcome Measure

Number of serious injuries in traffic crashes – GOHS set a 5-year rolling average target at 3,619.6. Based on the State 5-year rolling average actuals for 2019-2023, Number of serious injuries was 3,619.6. The projected target is on track to be met.

#### The C-3 Core Performance Outcome Measure

**Fatalities/VMT** – GOHS set a 5-year rolling average target at 1.72. Based on the State 5-year rolling average actuals for 2019-2023, Number of serious injuries was 1.616. The projected target is on track to be met.

#### **The C-4 Core Performance Outcome Measure**

**Number of unrestrained passenger vehicle occupant fatalities, all seat positions -** GOHS developed a 3-year annual performance measure target by conducting a statistical forecasting analysis of 2016-2022 state fatality data. Based on current State Crash data for 2023 of 361, the projected target of 267 is not on track to be met.

#### The C-5 Core Performance Outcome Measure

Number of fatalities in crashes involving a driver or motorcycle operator with a BAC of .08 and above - GOHS developed a 3-year annual performance measure target by conducting a statistical forecasting analysis of 2016-2022 state fatality data. The difference between the requirements from pulling data from ADOT State Crash files, GOHS chose to default to FARS to compute the performance target until there is sufficient data from ADOT to establish future trends. Based on current FARS data for 2022 of 450, the projected target of 413 is not on track to be met.

#### **The C-6 Core Performance Outcome Measure**

GOHS developed a 3-year annual performance measure target by conducting a statistical forecasting analysis of 2016-2022 state fatality data. Based on current State Crash data for 2023 of 446, the projected target of 417 is not on track to be met.

#### The C-7 Core Performance Outcome Measure

GOHS developed a 3-year annual performance measure target by conducting a statistical forecasting analysis of 2016-2022 state fatality data. Based on current State Crash data for 2023 of 258, the projected target of 222 is on track to be met.

#### **The C-8 Core Performance Outcome Measure**

GOHS developed a 3-year annual performance measure target by conducting a statistical forecasting analysis of 2016-2022 state fatality data. Based on current State Crash data for 2023 of 75, the projected target of 78 is on track to be met

#### The C-9 Core Performance Outcome Measure

GOHS developed a 3-year annual performance measure target by conducting a statistical forecasting analysis of 2016-2022 state fatality data. Based on current State Crash data for 2023 of 187, the projected target of 148 is not on track to be met.

#### The C-10 Core Performance Outcome Measure

GOHS developed a 3-year annual performance measure target by conducting a statistical forecasting analysis of 2016-2022 state fatality data. Based on current State Crash data for 2023 of 271, the projected target of 296 is on track to be met.

#### **The C-11 Core Performance Outcome Measure**

GOHS developed a 3-year annual performance measure target by conducting a statistical forecasting analysis of 2016-2022 state fatality data. Based on current State Crash data for 2023 of 44, the projected target of 47 is on track to be met.

#### **The B-1 Core Performance Outcome Measure**

GOHS developed a 3-year annual performance measure target by conducting a statistical forecasting analysis of 2016-2022 state survey data. Based on recently published State Survey data for 2023 of 87.8%, the projected target of 89% is still undetermined as FY 2024 survey data is not available until December 2024 to foresee the projected target to be met.

GOHS will actively seek feedback to expand our partnerships with non-traditional organizations such as school districts, faith-based organizations, older driver communities, tribal, and military to ensure that our ongoing collaboration with stakeholders leads to the implementation of research-based policies at the state level.

The new Strategic Highway Safety Plan (SHSP) signifies a significant shift towards a Safe System Approach, promoting a unified Safety Culture throughout Arizona. Through these comprehensive strategies, GOHS aims to engage the community and inspire lasting behavioral change. GOHS will fund Highway Safety Plan (HSP) program areas through enforcement, public awareness, public participation and engagement, and education, while also providing more grants.

All highway safety programs—including occupant protection, pedestrian and bicycle safety, motorcycle safety, impaired driving, distracted driving, speed and reckless driving, traffic records, accident investigation, emergency medical services, and roadway safety—will be enhanced using a more robust data-driven analysis.

GOHS will collaborate with the Arizona Department of Transportation (ADOT) and the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) to identify critical program areas where fatalities are most prominent, enabling strategic resource allocation. Our new public participation and engagement philosophy ensures that programs now focus on community-specific traffic safety needs, all supported by data-driven analysis.
