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IMPAIRED DRIVING

Updates to Triennial HSP

Adjustments to Countermeasure Strategy for Programming Funds

As reported in New York's FFY 2022 Highway Safety Annual Report, the five-year average number of drugged driving fatalities increased steadily over the five-year period 2017-2021. In addition, there is concern over the proportions of the state's yearly fatalities that are drug-related (28%, 40% and 25% in 2019, 2020, and 2021, respectively, compared to 24% in 2015).

Several factors may be related to the increasing incidence of drugged driving. Some drivers may assume that because a drug is not illegal, or because a medication is prescribed, it is ok to drive after using it. Drivers are taking prescription medication more now than in the past and may not realize that mixing them with other prescriptions and/or alcohol has a negative effect. The legalization of recreational cannabis in neighboring states, before legalization in New York in 2021, may also be contributing to increases in drugged driving fatalities in New York. Enforcing drugged driving violations can be more challenging than alcohol-related violations due to the limitations of drug impairment detecting technology and the lack of an established per se limit to determine drug impairment. Until such science-based technology is developed, the best tool traffic safety professionals have is the DRE.

The following initiatives will be undertaken or expanded to reduce the number of fatalities in drugged driving crashes:

- GTSC is planning to increase training as much as possible for law enforcement officers to recognize impaired drivers.
- GTSC is working with the Division of Criminal Justice Services (DCJS) to train law enforcement officers to better recognize individuals impaired by cannabis.
- GTSC will encourage and support law enforcement agencies to conduct more checkpoints and highvisibility details.

Changes to Performance Plan

No new performance measures have been added in the Impaired Driving program area.

POLICE TRAFFIC SERVICES

Updates to Triennial HSP

Adjustments to Countermeasure Strategy for Programming Funds

The increase in speeding-related fatalities shown in the FFY 2022 Highway Safety Annual Report is of great concern to GTSC. Although the five-year moving average for these fatalities had declined steadily from 2017 to 2019 (from 319.4 to 292.4), sharp annual increases in speeding-related fatalities in 2020 and 2021 caused the average to rise to 318.6 in 2021. This increase is consistent with national trends seen during the COVID-19 pandemic, where a surge in risky driving behaviors including speeding was associated with an increase in fatalities, even as vehicle miles traveled decreased.

GTSC plans to continue its data-driven approach to target crashes involving speeding through the following:

- Based upon a recent data analysis to determine "hot spot" speed-related crash locations, identified focus communities will be encouraged to conduct sustained speed enforcement activities.
- Conduct two statewide "Speed Awareness Week" enforcement and engagement mobilizations.
- Form a state-level workgroup to guide short- and long-term collaborative efforts geared toward reducing speeds, engaging the public and mitigating crashes caused by unsafe speed.

Changes to Performance Plan

No new performance measures have been added in the Police Traffic Services program area.

MOTORCYCLE SAFETY

Updates to Triennial HSP

Adjustments to Countermeasure Strategy for Programming Funds

The increase in motorcyclist fatalities is of great concern to GTSC. As presented in the FFY 2022 Highway Safety Annual Report, although the five-year moving average for these fatalities had declined from 2017 to 2019 (from 149.0 to 143.0), sharp increases in motorcyclist fatalities in 2020 and 2021 caused the average to rise to 162.2. This increase is consistent with national trends seen during the COVID-19 pandemic, where overall traffic fatalities rose 7% from 2019 to 2020, and fatalities among motorcyclists increased by 9%, even as vehicle miles traveled decreased 13% (NHTSA Report No. DOT HS 813 115 & DOT HS 813 118).

Along with the increase in motorcyclist fatalities, the sharp rise in unhelmeted motorcyclist fatalities is of great concern to GTSC. The five-year average for these fatalities had declined from 11.2 in 2017 to 8.8 in 2019, but increased to 12.4 in 2021, after that year's high annual fatality total of 20.

GTSC plans to continue its data-driven approach to target motorcyclist fatalities and unhelmeted motorcyclist fatalities through the following:

- Expand motorcycle enforcement education and improve the curriculum.
- Work with the Department of Health on new updated public service announcements.
- Move messaging across the state to follow the most up-to-date crash data.

The increase in the number of fatal and PI crashes involving a motorcycle and another vehicle in the high-risk counties of Kings, Queens, Bronx, Suffolk, New York and Nassau is also of great concern to GTSC. Although the five-year moving average for these fatalities declined from 2017 to 2020 (from 1,310.4 to 1,289.0), a sharp annual increase pushed the five-year average for 2021 to 1,312.0.

GTSC has already begun to implement initiatives to increase motorists' awareness of motorcycles and thereby reduce these crashes. GTSC plans to continue its data-driven approach to target F & PI crashes involving a motorcycle and another vehicle in high-risk counties through the following:

• Replace gas station marketing with a new marketing campaign to expand the reach to the motoring public.

Changes to Performance Plan

No new performance measures have been added in the Motorcycle Safety program area.

NON-MOTORIZED

Updates to Triennial HSP

Adjustments to Countermeasure Strategy for Programming Funds

According to NHTSA, in 2020 there was a 9% increase in pedalcyclists killed (938) from the 859 pedalcyclists killed in 2019 (Report No. DOT HS 813 322). NYS Accident Information System (AIS) data show that the top contributing factors to bicycle crashes continue to be Driver Inattention/Distraction and Failure to Yield Right of Way. The third most frequently cited factor in crashes involving bicycles is Bicyclist Error/Confusion. New York's laws related to sharing the road with bicyclists may not be well understood, indicating that there is an ongoing need for public education and outreach in this area. In addition, the incidence of driver distraction may be worsening due to the increased use of and reliance on smart phones and other electronics resulting in more bicyclists being struck. There is also a greater use of e-bicycles and e-scooters, especially in New York City. Outside of New York City, bicycle safety enforcement is not routinely conducted.

The following adjustments will be made to the state's highway safety program to reduce the number of bicyclists killed and injured in crashes:

- GTSC has partnered with the New York Bicycling Coalition to craft and deliver a training course for law enforcement which will be implemented in FFY 2024. Officers will be educated on the applicable vehicle and traffic laws and given information about conducting enforcement operations, if warranted.
- GTSC has partnered with NYCDOT to conduct awareness training related to the use of e-bicycles and e-scooters. This will continue in FFY 2024.
- GTSC will continue to emphasize law-based programming (in-person and/or virtual) to educate bicyclists and drivers on New York's conditional yielding law and other rules of the road which may not be understood by casual cyclists.
- GTSC will emphasize school-based programming delivered through Physical Education and/or Health classes to educate children about bicycling laws and how to navigate traffic as a bicyclist.
- GTSC will use the state's federal 405h funds to recruit new partners/projects to focus on these bicycle safety efforts. Many new projects came online in FFY 2021.
- GTSC will craft social media messages to educate drivers and bicyclists about applicable laws and best practices to coexist safely on the road.
- GTSC and its traffic safety partners are planning to hold the "Walk-Bike NY" symposium in FFY 2024 in Binghamton, NY, to provide additional educational and engagement opportunities.

Changes to Performance Plan

No new performance measures have been added in the Non-Motorized program area.

OCCUPANT PROTECTION

Updates to Triennial HSP

Adjustments to Countermeasure Strategy for Programming Funds

As indicated in New York's FFY 2022 Annual Report, the increase in unrestrained vehicle occupant fatalities, together with the lower rate of observed seat belt use, are of great concern to GTSC. The increase in fatalities is consistent with national trends seen during and after the COVID-19 pandemic, where a surge in risky driving behaviors including failure to buckle up was associated with an increase in fatalities.

GTSC plans to continue its data-driven approach to target crashes involving unrestrained vehicle occupants and to encourage greater seat belt use through the following:

- Training of non-certified CPS law enforcement officers on how to identify and intervene on car seat
 misuse or non-use as well as laws concerning CPS and the new Occupant Protection law that was
 passed in November 2020.
- Facebook posts to specifically bring attention to occupant protection and the new occupant protection law.

Changes to Performance Plan

No new performance measures have been added in the Occupant Protection program area.

COMMUNITY TRAFFIC SAFETY PROGRAMS

Updates to Triennial HSP

Adjustments to Countermeasure Strategy for Programming Funds

The increase in the number of drivers age 20 or younger involved in fatal crashes is of great concern to GTSC. New York has adjusted its Triennial Highway Safety Plan to increase the programs aimed at teen and young adult driver safety.

Changes to Performance Plan

No new performance measures have been added in the Community Traffic Safety Programs area.

TRAFFIC RECORDS

Updates to Triennial HSP

Adjustments to Countermeasure Strategy for Programming Funds

As shown in New York's FFY 2022 Annual Report, the target of 97.71% established with regard to completeness related to the AIS was not met. The percentage of crash records with no missing data in the Roadway Type field decreased from 96.74% in the baseline period (April 1, 2020-March 31, 2021) to 95.81% in the performance period (April 1, 2021-March 31, 2022). The increase was likely not met due to the ongoing loss of knowledgeable staff, the continuous hiring and training process of new staff and the implementation and training on the new CLEAR system. The full implementation of NYSDOT's new CLEAR system will continue to provide more complete data for this and other fields in FFY 2024-2026.

Regarding the timeliness of the TSLED citation data, the mean number of days from the citation date to the date the citation is entered into the TSLED database rose from 8.29 days in the baseline period (April 1, 2020-March 31, 2021) to 10.18 days in the performance period (April 1, 2021-March 31, 2022), missing the goal of 8.21 days set in the FFY 2022 strategic plan. This increase can be attributed to a technical issue with the transmission and processing of data that was identified and resolved during FFY 2022. Timeliness should improve in FFY 2024-2026.

Changes to Performance Plan

The following new performance measure has been added in the Traffic Records program area: Increase the number of electronic crash reports received by 2.5% from 64.39% (2021 baseline) to 66.01% by 2026 with annual benchmarks of 64.71% (0.5%) by 2024 and 65.36% (1.0%) by 2025.

PLANNING & ADMINISTRATION

Updates to Triennial HSP

Adjustments to Countermeasure Strategy for Programming Funds

As reported in New York's FFY 2022 Annual Report, the following Program Management targets were set for FFY 2022:

- Strengthen GTSC's role in setting goals and priorities for the state's highway safety program
- Identify highway safety problems and solutions to reduce fatalities and injuries on New York State's roadways
- Continue to promote the implementation of the state's Evidence-Based Traffic Safety Enforcement Program (TSEP)
- Provide direction, guidance, and assistance to support the efforts of public and private partners to improve highway safety
- Develop and maintain policies and procedures that provide for the effective, efficient and economical operation of the highway safety program
- Continue to expand technology as a means to disseminate traffic safety information, including online grant applications and using the internet to disseminate safety information through multi-media channels
- Coordinate and provide training opportunities and programs for New York State's traffic safety professionals
- Support the use of performance measures as an evaluation tool in the state's highway safety program
- Improve the timeliness of grant approvals and the allocation and liquidation of funding

GTSC was successful in meeting the targets related to the management of the state's Section 402 and incentive grant programs presented in the FFY 2022 Highway Safety Strategic Plan (HSSP). Therefore, New York will continue its performance-based planning approach for the statewide traffic safety program as well as its other strategies for conducting and managing the state's highway safety program.

Changes to Performance Plan

No new performance measures have been added in the Program Management program area.

New York State FFY 2025 Section 405(b) Occupant Protection Grant Application

Introduction

New York's annual seat belt observation survey conducted in June 2023 resulted in a statewide seat belt use rate of 94.11%, consistent with the pre-pandemic level of use in 2019. By once again exceeding the minimum seat belt use rate of 90.0% established by 23 CFR 1300.21(b), New York State is eligible to apply for a Section 405(b) Occupant Protection grant for FFY 2025 as a "high seat belt use" state.

The following sections provide documentation demonstrating that New York meets the criteria required to qualify for an FFY 2025 Section 405(b) Occupant Protection Grant.

Occupant Protection Plan

New York's Occupant Protection program area plan submitted in its FFY 2024-2026 Triennial Highway Safety Plan (3HSP) has been updated for FFY 2025 and is included as a separate attachment. It incorporates the updates to the countermeasure strategies and data in the 3HSP identified under the Occupant Protection program area in the FFY 2025 Annual Grant Application (AGA). The projects that will be funded in FFY 2025 to implement the updated Occupant Protection program plan are provided in the FFY 2025 Project and Subrecipient list included in the AGA.

Participation in Click-It-or-Ticket (CIOT) National Mobilization

New York's Buckle Up New York/Click It-or-Ticket (BUNY/CIOT) program will continue to be the state's primary enforcement strategy for occupant protection. In FFY 2025, the BUNY program will promote the national CIOT mobilization scheduled for May 2025; all police agencies receiving Governor's Traffic Safety Committee (GTSC) Police Traffic Services (PTS) grants are required to participate in the May high-visibility enforcement campaign.

Agencies receiving grant funding are also required to:

- Have a mandatory seat belt use policy and review the roll call training flyer
- Conduct high-visibility, zero-tolerance enforcement using checkpoints, saturation patrols and, when possible, include nighttime enforcement and collaborative interagency efforts
- Focus on low-use groups based on geography, demographics, and other factors





While grant funding supports the participation of a large number of police agencies, nearly every police agency in the state actively supports the CIOT campaign and the annual seat belt enforcement mobilization. New York also participates with the surrounding states of Connecticut, Massachusetts, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, and Vermont in a cooperative "Border to Border" seat belt enforcement effort.

Child Passenger Safety (CPS) Program

The second major focus of New York's Occupant Protection Program is the safety of young children riding in vehicles. The emphasis in this area is on educating parents and caregivers on the importance of using the child restraint system that is appropriate for the child's height, weight, age, and developmental ability, as



well as providing hands-on instruction on how to properly install child restraints in vehicles. The use of an appropriate child restraint system that is correctly installed and properly adjusted is an important countermeasure for reducing fatalities and the severity of injuries suffered by young passengers in crashes. Ensuring that access to this education and training is available to residents in all areas of New York State, both urban and rural, and to the populations that are most at risk, including low-income groups and minority populations, are priorities of New York's program.

GTSC's commitment to maintaining a strong CPS program is demonstrated by the designation of a GTSC staff member to serve as a full-time Statewide CPS Coordinator. New York's CPS Advisory Board, which is comprised of a representative from each of the state's 14 designated CPS regions, also plays a major role in all aspects of the program.

Funding for local and state entities to provide education and services is made available through GTSC's CPS mini-grant program. Mini-grants are available in the following categories: CPS Fitting Stations, CPS Awareness Classes, Car Seat Check Events, and Car Seat Education & Distribution Programs. In order to receive funding, grantees must agree to comply with stringent guidelines that ensure standards of quality, service, and safety are maintained and that certified technicians are available at each fitting station during the posted hours of operation and at each car seat check event that is held.

Local programs must demonstrate that they are providing CPS services to meet the needs of all families within their jurisdictions, including those that may require special attention due to language and cultural differences. GTSC awarded a total of 169 CPS mini-grants throughout the state in FFY 2024; 172 applications for mini-grants have been received for FFY 2025. These projects are provided in the FFY 2025 Project and Subrecipient listing included in the AGA.

Child Restraint Inspection Stations

New York continues to maintain an active network of permanent fitting stations across the state. As of June 6, 2024, there are 312 fitting stations in New York. This includes 117 fitting station grantees who receive funding through GTSC, many of which oversee multiple fitting stations within their jurisdiction.

A complete list of fitting stations organized by county is maintained on the GTSC website (https://trafficsafety.ny.gov). For each fitting station, the location, hours of operation and contact information for questions and scheduling appointments are provided. The listing also identifies those fitting stations with Spanish-speaking technicians available. GTSC regularly verifies and updates the information posted on the website.

These fitting stations, which are located in fire stations, police stations, hospitals, and other permanent locations, offer information and instruction on the appropriate restraint system to use based on the age and size of the child and the proper installation of that restraint. GTSC requires that fitting stations be staffed by CPS Technicians and/or Instructors with current certification status to ensure that the standards of the program are maintained.

Population Covered by New York's Network of Inspection Stations

New York's 312 fitting stations are located throughout the state. The U.S. Census defines a county as rural if 50% or more of the county's population resides in areas designated as rural. Based on this definition, the counties in New York State are almost evenly split between urban and rural. In the table below, the 32 counties categorized as "rural" are highlighted in blue.

As depicted in the table, 229 fitting stations serve urban counties, and 105 serve rural counties. Some fitting stations serve multiple counties. Even though only 10% of the state's population resides in counties designated as rural, approximately one-third of the fitting stations serve these counties, indicating the importance placed on providing access to the residents in the more sparsely populated and generally lower income areas of the state.

The table also shows the number of fitting stations and the counties where they are located that focus on serving minority and low-income populations based on the information provided in their applications for minigrant funding. For FFY 2025, 168 fitting stations stated that they focus on serving minority populations; 101 fitting stations reported serving low-income families.

To show the extent to which car seat education and distribution programs are available to meet the needs of low-income families in the state, the table also indicates the counties where programs supported with funding from GTSC are located. In FFY 2025, funding will be provided for 82 low-income car seat education and distribution programs; at least one of these programs is located in 51 of the state's 62 counties.

Outreach to Underserved Populations

While the vast majority of New York's population resides in counties with active fitting stations, additional efforts to reach the underserved are also important components of New York's occupant protection program. One of the outreach strategies to further increase access to education and car seat fitting services to rural, low-income, minority and other underserved populations is to bring the fitting station to them. Each year, GTSC provides funding for storage trailers that double as mobile fitting stations to make car seat fittings more accessible and convenient for underserved populations in both rural and urban areas.

In addition, efforts are made to conduct CPS Certification Training courses in those areas with underserved populations and to find agencies to partner with who can provide the space for low-income car seat education and distribution programs to be established.

Where appropriate, several grantees in New York State reach out to the diverse populations that they serve by working with interpreters to assist technicians. Because of New York's large Spanish-speaking population, many fitting stations have technicians on staff who are bilingual. To date, 97 of the certified technicians in New York State are bilingual in English and Spanish. Another strategy to increase accessibility for diverse groups is to encourage the establishment of fitting stations within specific communities. Examples of these types of outreach programs are described below.

Mohawk Valley Resource Center for Refugees (MVRCR)

The MVRCR works with multiple language groups and provides education to a low-income population of primarily refugees and immigrants. Car seat education and distribution services are organized by language groups with support from interpreters. Referrals to the program come from the adult English Language Learners (ELL) School, St Luke's Memorial Hospital, the Oneida County Health Department and other local social services agencies, such as the Neighborhood Center and CareNet. In order to build and sustain a strong team of CPS technicians, the MVRCR has been focusing on ensuring that existing CPS Technicians complete their recertification requirements and recruiting additional bilingual technicians. Because of the cultural diversity of the population that is served by the MVRCR, it is essential that the CPS educational services be provided in a context that is relevant to the experience of the refugees and immigrants who are receiving assistance. The MVRCR has developed a unique

approach to illustrate the importance of securing children in car seats that has proven successful with the population it serves.

> Albany County Department of Public Works

Albany County has experienced a large increase in the number of refugees and immigrants residing within the county. Much of the increase is the result of the placement of families by agencies including the United States Committee on Refugees and Immigrants which places approximately 300 families per year in the county. Most of these families arrive from countries that do not have CPS programs. Many parents do not have car seats and those who do often find the training challenging due to language barriers and other factors. In addition, because many immigrant and refugee families share vehicles, education on installing seats in a number of different vehicle models is needed. The Albany County Department of Public Works is providing car seat checks and CPS education that focuses on the needs of this growing population. In addition, car seats are provided free of charge to low-income families.

> Ardent Solutions

Ardent Solutions, Inc., a nonprofit public health program based in western New York State, provides outreach to underserved diverse populations in a number of traffic safety program areas. Activities conducted in the area of CPS include the establishment of a car seat fitting station in Salamanca, New York, to provide services to the Seneca Nation of Indians. In addition to continuing to operate the fitting station and distribution programs, Ardent Solutions continues to provide occupant protection awareness trainings.

Children with Special Needs

The establishment of additional special needs car seat fitting stations at hospitals with certified CPS technicians on staff who have completed the Riley Children's Hospital special needs technician training is also a priority. As more certified technicians complete the special needs training, more fitting stations outside of a hospital setting are able to assist families with special needs children. Currently, New York has 128 certified technicians who are also special needs certified. In FFY 2025, GTSC will work with the NYS Association of Traffic Safety Boards and the NYS Department of Health to offer at least one CPS and Special Needs training to increase the state's capacity to offer these services.

GTSC will fund CPS inspection stations, check events, awareness programs and car seat education and distribution programs are provided in the FYY 2025 Project and Subrecipient list included in the AGA.

Child Passenger Safety Technicians

The availability of a large pool of persons with the training, knowledge, and skills to identify when a car seat is installed incorrectly, determine the correct installation for the seat, and demonstrate the proper installation, including the use of the LATCH system, to parents and other caregivers is essential to sustaining the state's CPS program. Persons interested in becoming certified CPS technicians must complete a three- or four-day Standardized Child Passenger Safety Technician Course provided by Safe Kids Worldwide.



Persons successfully completing this training are certified for two years. To be recertified after two years, CPS technicians must earn six Continuing Education Units (CEU) and demonstrate the proper installation of five different types of car seats before a certified instructor or technician proxy.

GTSC provides support for the delivery of standardized CPS Certification Courses for new technicians, as well as update training classes. Continuing Education Units (CEU) that can be used toward recertification are available



for the technicians who attend these update training classes. CPS technicians are also able to earn continuing education units toward their recertification by attending the workshops presented at the Child Passenger Safety Technical Conferences that are conducted every other year. If a certified technician fails to recertify, GTSC supports the presentation of the Safe Kids mandated one-day Renewal Testing seminars. GTSC covers the recertification fees for technicians and instructors. Despite attrition of instructors due to COVID, New York's continuing efforts to retain its certified technicians have enabled the state to maintain a recertification rate of 60% in 2023, which exceeds the national average of 52%.

Certified CPS technicians are encouraged to participate in car seat check events during the year and to maintain their skills by installing car seats in other settings. Technicians are also encouraged to attend specialized training that will enable them to master additional skills, such as fitting children with special needs and fitting children on school buses. In addition to providing one-on-one instruction in the correct installation and use of car seats, the presentation of CPS awareness classes to groups of parents, grandparents, caregivers and others who transport children is another important educational activity supported by New York's occupant protection program.

The CPS technician program began in 1999 with 98 certified technicians and nine instructors. While other states have lost technicians and instructors in recent years, New York has remained steady, despite the number of technicians who lost their certifications during COVID. As of March 8, 2024, New York has a total of 2,029 nationally certified CPS technicians. Among them, 104 are instructors, and seven are instructor

candidates. Every county in New York State has at least one CPS technician. A map showing the distribution of the certified CPS technicians by county in New York State is included below. Westchester County has the highest number of technicians (161), followed by Monroe County (157). Please note that not all technicians are assigned to a designated county by Safe Kids Worldwide, so the regions below may not add up to 2,029.

New York's Certified CPS Technicians come from a variety of backgrounds, representing law enforcement (local police, County Sheriffs and State Police); emergency medical services and fire departments, health and social service agencies.

CPS Certified Technician Recruitment and Training Plan

New York State has been successful in maintaining an adequate number of nationally certified CPS technicians to provide statewide coverage of the fitting stations and car seat check events that are scheduled. A major key to the success of the state's recruitment efforts is making the required standardized CPS technician training available and accessible. In FFY 2023, a total of 24 Standardized CPS Technician Training classes were conducted resulting in 363 newly certified technicians. A total of 28 classes were planned for FFY 2024.

The objectives of New York's FFY 2025 recruitment and training plan are to 1) maintain the state's large cadre of technicians through continued support for training programs for new and recertifying technicians and 2) increase the focus on counties with low numbers of technicians and meeting the needs of underserved populations in the state.

Through its CPS Coordinator, GTSC will continue to publicize the state's CPS program and coordinate training programs and other events that support recruitment efforts. The CPS Coordinator works closely with the state's CPS Advisory Board, which is comprised of representatives from the 14 regions of the state. In addition to serving as a statewide communication network for the program, these regional representatives assist with technician recruitment and training efforts by identifying areas of their regions where more technicians are needed, organizing training programs, and recruiting participants.

The 14 CPS Advisory Board representatives are working with the grantees in their regions to schedule up to three CPS Certification training courses for the coming year. The table below identifies the number and location of the 39 CPS training classes tentatively planned for FFY 2025, and the estimated number of students needed to not only maintain, but to expand the pool of certified technicians in New York State. The delivery of these classes depends on the availability of the location and instructors, as well as the number of enrollees. A minimum enrollment of 10 is required to hold a course with a maximum of 25 students per course.

New York State FFY 2025 Section 405(c) State Traffic Safety Information System Improvements Grant Application

Introduction

The need for accurate and timely traffic records data continues to be a critical element of performance-based program planning processes used by the state's traffic safety agencies and organizations to develop traffic safety initiatives. In developing appropriate countermeasures to meet these challenges, the traffic safety community needs data on crashes and injuries, citations and convictions for traffic violations, and highway engineering initiatives. New York strives to meet the needs for data and data analysis support through major improvements in the way it maintains and uses its traffic records systems. To accomplish this, the NYS Governor's Traffic Safety Committee (GTSC) works closely with the Institute for Traffic Safety Management & Research (ITSMR), the state's Traffic Records Coordinating Committee (TRCC) and its TRCC Coordinator.

Established as a coalition of agencies and organizations that seek to improve and promote traffic safety in New York, the TRCC serves as the working committee for the GTSC's agencies in developing the state's annual traffic records strategic plan. The TRCC meets at least three times a year, and the TRCC Coordinator coordinates and supports the operation of the TRCC. The most recent strategic plan, *Traffic Safety Information Systems Strategic Plan: FFY 2025*, was approved by the TRCC membership on April 26, 2024.

The following sections provide documentation demonstrating that New York meets the criteria required to qualify for a FFY 2025 Section 405(c) State Traffic Safety Information Improvement grant. Certification of a functioning TRCC, a designated TRCC Coordinator and a traffic record strategic plan is provided in Appendix B.

Quantitative Improvement

Six performance targets were established in the FFY 2024 strategic plan: three for the AIS crash information system, two for the TSLED citation/adjudication system and one for the AA citation/adjudication system. The performance measures used to monitor progress in this area focus on 1) the timeliness of the crash and citation/adjudication data and 2) the accuracy and completeness of the crash data.

Description of Performance Measures

- Timeliness of the crash data: the performance measure is the mean number of days from the date a crash occurs to the date the crash report is entered into the AIS database.
- Accuracy of the crash data: the performance measure is the percentage of crash records with no errors in the *Lat/Long Coordinates* data element.
- Completeness of the crash data: the performance measure is the percentage of crash records in AIS that have gone through the location coding process with no missing data in the data element of *Roadway Type*.
- Timeliness measures for the citation and adjudication data are the mean number of days from 1) the date a citation is issued under the TSLED system to the date the citation is entered into the TSLED database, 2) the date a TSLED citation is adjudicated until the date the disposition information is entered into the state's TSLED database, and 3) the date a citation is issued under the AA system to the date the citation is entered into the AA database.

Performance Targets Established for FFY 2024

The table below shows that all six performance measures established for FFY 2024 met their targets:

- 1) The timeliness of the crash reports entered in the AIS database decreased from 10.21 days in the baseline period to 9.75 days in the performance period, exceeding the target of 10.10 days.
- 2) The percentage of crash records with no errors in the critical data element of *Lat/Long Coordinates* increased from 74.27% in the baseline period to 75.71% in the performance period, exceeding the target of 75.01%.
- 3) The percentage of crash records with no missing data in the critical data element of *Roadway Type* increased from 85.23% in the baseline period to 87.21% in the performance period, exceeding the target of 86.08%.
- 4) The timeliness of the TSLED citations entered in the TSLED database decreased from 7.62 days in the baseline period to 5.65 days in the performance period, exceeding the target of 7.54 days.
- 5) The timeliness of the TLSED dispositions between when the citation is adjudicated until it is entered into TSLED decreased from 39.29 days in the baseline period to 18.52 days in the performance period, exceeding the target of 38.89 days.
- 6) The timeliness of the AA citations data dropped from 5.12 days in the baseline period to 5.00 days in the performance period, exceeding the target of 5.06 days.

New York State FFY 2025 Section 405(f) Motorcyclist Safety Grant Application

Introduction

Improving the safety of motorcyclists continues to be a priority for the state's highway safety program. Since motorcycles share the road with much larger vehicles, a combination of strategies must be used to ensure safe riding practices and awareness of motorcyclists on our roadways. New York State has a comprehensive motorcycle safety program that supports motorcycle awareness, motorcycle helmet usage, responsible use of alcohol, and rider education, skill development and licensing. New York's universal motorcycle helmet law is a strategy that has proven to be highly effective in reducing motorcyclist injuries and fatalities.

The following sections provide documentation demonstrating that New York meets two of the criteria required to qualify for a FFY 2025 Section 405(f) Motorcyclist Safety grant.

Motorcycle Rider Training Course

The New York State DMV contracts with the Motorcycle Safety Foundation (MSF), a national leader in motorcycle safety and education, to deliver the MSF Basic Rider Course throughout the state. In addition to user fees, a portion of the motorcycle license and registration fees collected by the state is set aside to fund these training programs. No NHTSA monies are used to fund this program.

Currently, there are 20 counties with training sites where motorcycle rider training courses will be conducted during FFY 2025. As shown in the table below, collectively these counties account for 51.6% of the motorcycle registrations in the state, demonstrating compliance with Section 405(f) Motorcyclist Safety Criterion: Motorcycle Riding Training Course.

The road test waiver offered by New York's rider training program provides an additional incentive for new motorcyclists to complete a motorcycle rider education course and become licensed operators without having to take a DMV road test. From 2018 to 2022, approximately 70% of all new motorcycle licenses were issued to graduates of the rider training program who waived the DMV road test. The Basic Rider Course 2 (BRC2-LW) and the Three-Wheeled Motorcycle BRC (3WBRC) also qualify for the road test waiver benefit.

Maintaining the quality of the instructor cadre in terms of skills, knowledge and motivation is a challenge in every program. To maintain a high-quality program, New York will continue to use a variety of outreach methods to improve the availability of training for providers and instructors and aid in the retention of qualified instructors. An MSF-qualified quality assurance team makes visits to the public training sites to ensure the program continues to maintain high standards for course delivery.

Motorcyclist Awareness Program

Communication strategies and outreach activities directed toward the other drivers who share the road with motorcyclists are very important for improving motorcycle safety. The counties within New York State that have been identified as having the highest numbers of fatal and personal injury (F&PI) crashes involving a motorcycle and another motor vehicle will be the primary focus of the activities conducted under this program in FFY 2025. Based on 2022 state crash data, the counties that collectively accounted for the majority (57%) of F&PI crashes involving a motorcycle and another vehicle are all in the downstate region: Kings, Queens, Bronx and New York counties in New York City and Suffolk and Nassau counties on Long Island.

Performance Measure and Performance Target

New York's performance measure and corresponding performance target developed for motorcycle awareness are shown in the Performance Plan section of the FFY 2024-2026 Triennial HSP. The performance measure tracks the number of fatal and personal injury crashes involving a motorcycle and another motor vehicle in the following high-risk counties: Kings, Queens, Bronx, Suffolk, New York, and Nassau. Based on the most recent data, the five-year moving average number of these crashes increased from 1,312.0 in 2021 to 1,339.8 in 2022. A performance target of 1,292.3 was set for 2026.

Motorcycle Awareness Projects

Projects that raise motorist awareness of the need to watch for motorcycles in traffic and educate the general driving population on how to share the road safely with motorcycles will be supported under the Motorcyclist Awareness Program. These efforts include New York's participation in the national initiative recognizing May as Motorcycle Safety Awareness Month, the use of variable message signs promoting motorcycle safety and public awareness campaigns, and public information and education (PI&E) materials that promote the Share the Road message. The Motorcycle Safety Workgroup formed by GTSC will also continue to investigate various avenues of communication with the motoring public to design new motorcycle safety messaging and awareness ideas.

Outreach efforts to enhance driver awareness of motorcycles will also continue to be considered for funding. Examples include attendance at auto shows, fairs and other public events; presentations to driver education classes; and the use of social media to reach general and targeted audiences. The development of PI&E

materials that can be distributed to various audiences and through other channels will also be supported. The outreach efforts and other activities that focus on raising motorist awareness and educating the general driving public about motorcycle safety will be supported by 405(f) Motorcyclist Safety Grant funds.

Some specific examples of the motorist awareness communications and outreach that will be conducted in FFY 2025 include the following:

- A Motorcycle Safety Awareness Month press event will be held in counties with high rates of motorcycle crashes, injuries and fatalities.
- Variable Message Signs will be displayed during popular motorcycle-related rallies and events to alert drivers of increased motorcycle traffic.
- A geotargeted campaign featuring awareness messaging will be deployed to reach motorists in specific areas of the state that experience a high number or rate of motorcycle crashes.
- A campaign to have motorcycle awareness messages displayed on video screens at selected gas stations within counties with high numbers or rates of motorcycle crashes.
- GTSC will participate in motorcycle safety and awareness outreach at the International Automobile Show; Americade, the state's largest motorcycle rally; and other relevant events throughout the state.
- GTSC will partner with DMV to distribute motorcycle safety and awareness messaging via mass mailings to motorists.
- New motorcycle safety and awareness materials will be developed and distributed at a minimum of three traffic safety events as well as to county DMVs, grantees, and other traffic safety partners.
- A new motorcycle awareness PSA will be developed and filmed in partnership with NYS Dept of Health
- GTSC will partner with MSF (Motorcycle Safety Foundation) to hold a RIDE Day event to promote motorcycle safety.

VEHICLE STOPS AND TRAFFIC ENFORCEMENT PART 4 SECTION I (11 HOURS)

TOPIC DESCRIPTION

Instruction covers the basis for and objectives of traffic law enforcement, as well as the role of the police officer in traffic enforcement. Proper procedures associated with violator contact; verifying the validity and authenticity of a driver's license; vehicle registration and/or insurance identification card; and completion of a simplified traffic information are included. A practical exercise involving preparation of a simplified traffic information is required. Students are also required to participate in at least 2 mock traffic stop exercises. These exercises can be combined.

INSTRUCTOR QUALIFICATIONS

Instructors in this topic are generally expected to be those certified by the Municipal Police Training Council. They should be able to document this by producing a current certificate issued by the Council. This certificate should read the person is certified as a general topics instructor. Further, they should possess a background and experience in the topical area, as documented to the school director. This supporting documentation should remain a part of the course file in the academy, available for later inspection or audit.

If a school director believes an individual who is not certified is otherwise qualified for teaching this topic, they may ask in writing for approval for that person to teach. The Office of Public Safety may, if finding the individual possesses a combination of an advanced degree and unique or qualifying experience, find the individual to be qualified and be approved to instruct. Those that are found qualified, are listed as approved instructors, and will have a letter issued to them indicating what they are approved to instruct in. The school director should keep a copy of the letter in the school file.

School directors should understand the Office of Public Safety can only examine complete applications for instructors that are filed in a timely manner. Generally, this instructor approval often requires time that is in addition to the requirements (45 days by the State Regulation and the Municipal Police Training Council) for police training approval. This time allows for proper review of curriculum, instructors, and the needs for training in a zone. Complete applications are those which include a properly completed Instructor Personal History Form, and documents supporting the facts contained therein.

TRAINING OBJECTIVES

Upon completion of this section, the student will be able to:

- 1. Define traffic law enforcement.
- 2. Define selective enforcement and its relationship to community oriented policing and problem solving.
- 3. Identify actions an officer may take in response to a vehicle and traffic law violation.
- 4. Identify the proper procedures to interact with the operator and/or occupants of a stopped vehicle.
- 5. Identify the steps involved in ascertaining the validity and authenticity of a driver's license, vehicle registration and insurance identification card.
- 6. Properly complete a simplified traffic information within a specified period of time.
- 7. Recognize the circumstances when a custody arrest is authorized for a vehicle and traffic offense
- 8. Demonstrate proper procedures to effect a vehicle stop and interact with the vehicle operator and passengers.

CURRICULUM OUTLINE

- I Traffic Enforcement Generally.
 - A. Traffic law enforcement: is defined as the total law enforcement effort directed toward obtaining compliance with vehicle and traffic laws. At no time, should a person be singled out or otherwise treated differently solely based on race, ethnic origin, gender, age religion, sexual orientation, or income statue.
 - B. Objectives of traffic enforcement include:
 - 1. Deterring the traffic violator and the potential violator.
 - 2. Increasing the level of voluntary compliance with traffic laws and regulations.
 - C. Results of lax enforcement of traffic laws can include:
 - 1. Increased highway fatalities and injuries.
 - 2. Increased property damage.
 - 3. Impediment to efficient flow of traffic.
 - 4. Negative image of police efforts.
 - D. The role of a law enforcement officer in vehicle and traffic enforcement includes:
 - 1. Enforcing traffic laws.
 - 2. Controlling traffic.
 - Investigating crashes.
 - 4. Preparing accurate and complete reports.

Selective enforcement is defined as vehicle and traffic law enforcement directed toward the time and place of high traffic incident frequency and types of violations occurring.

E. The three major sub-groups within the vehicle and traffic law enforcement system are:

- Law enforcement agencies.
- 2. Courts.
- 3. Department of Motor Vehicles
- F. Possible actions an officer may take in response to a vehicle and traffic law violation include:
 - 1. Issue a verbal warning/educate the violator.
 - 2. Issue a uniform traffic ticket.
 - 3. Make a traffic-related arrest.
- G. Procedures for handling traffic offenders.
 - 1. Departmental policies and procedures regarding noncustodial and custodial events vary.
 - 2. Non-custodial events.
 - a. Procedures for issuing simplified traffic information.
 - b. Filing of simplified traffic information.
 - c. Violator's responsibility following issuance of simplified traffic information.
 - d. Explain process to violator.
 - 3. Custodial arrests.
 - a. Offenses warranting custodial arrest include:
 - (1) Driving under the influence of alcohol/drugs.
 - (2) Vehicle registration-suspended.
 - (3) Operator's license-suspended or revoked.
 - (4) No insurance
 - (5) Wanted/unable to positively identify operator.


- (6) Vehicle stolen.
- b. Searching of offender/vehicle.
 - (1) This must always be done in strict accordance with relevant laws, case law, and departmental policies and procedures.
 - (2) Laws relating to searching individuals and vehicles are thoroughly covered in the "Criminal Procedure Law" component (Section 3-C).
 - (3) Inventory searches are covered later in this lesson.
- II Vehicle pullovers.
 - A. Apprehending a traffic offender should never become a routine procedure in a police officer's mind.
 - B. Depending on circumstances, it may be desirable to run ("file check") a vehicle registration through NYSPIN prior to actually stopping the vehicle.
 - C. Cause exists for vehicle pullovers when an officer:
 - 1. Has reasonable suspicion that the vehicle/occupants were involved in suspected criminal activity.
 - 2. Observes vehicle/occupants violating vehicle and traffic laws.
 - 3. At no time, should a person be singled out or otherwise treated differently solely based on race, ethnic origin, gender, age, religion, sexual orientation, or income status.
 - D. Types of vehicle stops:
 - 1. Traffic or criminal offense
 - 2. Investigative
 - Felony/high risk stops
 - E. Information that should be transmitted to communications prior to stopping a vehicle includes:

- 1. Indicate traffic stop in progress
- 2. Location of stop
- 3. License plate number and issuing state
- 4. Vehicle and passenger(s) description (if officer is suspicious).
- F. Major considerations when selecting the proper location to make the stop include:
 - Width of road and shoulder.
 - 2. Presence of hills and curves
 - 3. Amount of traffic congestion
 - 4. Level of visibility (e.g. lighting)
 - 5. Problem areas (e.g. bars, nightclubs)
 - 6. Whenever possible, avoid stopping vehicles on a bridge
 - a. No place to tactically withdraw if needed
 - b. No place for cover, other than police car
 - c. If a struggle ensues officer/subject have potential to be thrown over bridge
 - d. Obstruction of Vehicular Traffic
 - 7. Wherever possible avoid stopping vehicles in tunnels
 - a. Same issues as above
 - b. If shots are fired they can travel along the inside of the walls and ceilings
 - c. Poor lighting conditions
- G. Equipment that can be used to make a stop includes:
 - 1. Siren
 - 2. Red lights

- Headlights
- 4. PA system
- 5. Horn
- 6. Spotlight(s)
- H. Pre-stop procedures which should be completed prior to the patrol vehicle coming to a stop include:
 - 1. Notify communications of any location change.
 - 2. Unlock the front passenger door if within easy reach and can be done safely (access to shotgun and radio).
 - 3. Have equipment ready at hand (e.g. portable radio, flashlight).
- I. Proper positioning of the patrol vehicle includes:
 - 1. Approximately 15 feet behind the vehicle.
 - 2. Approximately 3 feet off-set to the left.
 - 3. Leave at least some rearward flashing lights on during the entire stop.
- J. An officer should constantly observe the vehicle and occupants.
- K. The procedures to be followed while approaching the vehicle on foot include:
 - 1. Be aware of traffic conditions.
 - 2. Observe the driver and passengers by looking in the side or rear windows.
 - 3. Check the trunk to be sure it is closed.
 - 4. Approach the vehicle slowly and carefully from the patrol car to either:
 - a. Just behind the driver's door by the B-pillar
 - b. Passenger side at the B-pillar

- c. Considerations for determining the approach include:
 - (1) Traffic at location of stop
 - (2) Number of officers present
 - (3) Number of occupants in the vehicle
 - (4) Type of vehicle
- 5. Minimize exposure by standing just to the rear of the violator's vehicle, if rear seat occupied.
 - a. Newer vehicles may be equipped with sensors or cameras that can detect an officer's presence.
 - b. These devices could present some considerations for officer safety and should be discussed.
- 6. Visually check persons and passenger compartment for weapons.
- 7. Carry flashlight, if needed, leaving strong hand free for possible weapon use.
- 8. When you stop a car with tinted windows at night:
 - a. Make the occupants more visible and, conversely, to make you less visible to them is to alter the lighting situation. This can be accomplished by requesting that the driver roll the windows down, just as you would do on such a car during the day.
 - b. Use the public-address system; order them to turn on their vehicle's interior lighting.
 - c. Next, extinguish as much unnecessary lighting on the front of your car as possible, without compromising safety.
- 9. Force Science Institute's Traffic Stop Study and the "Mitigation Zone"
 - a. Study involved 93 officers and was intended to examine the influence of officer position on their safety relative to the B-Pillar of the stopped vehicle.

- b. The "mitigation zone" (MZ) is defined as an area where the officer is at a position of <u>reduced</u> risk because the configuration of the vehicle being stopped impairs or restricts the driver's visual access or weapon alignment on the officer. The MZ on the driver's side is defined by a 10° angle, extending outward from the B-Pillar and facing the rear of the vehicle.¹
- c. When the driver presented a handgun, and pointed it at the officer, officers who had approached on the passenger side could reach this mitigation zone approximately 0.5 seconds faster than those on the driver's side.
- d. Additionally, those who moved before attempting to draw their weapon were able to reach this zone an average of 0.39 seconds faster.
 - (1) Given the speed with which an offender can obtain a target and fire consecutive rounds at an officer, these numbers are significant in the real world.
 - (2) The study is made part of the appendix for this lesson or can be downloaded here: http://www.forcescience.org/articles/trafficstops.pdf



This graphical representation of the "mitigation zone" is not drawn to scale, but is intended to illustrate the area described in the study. It is important to note that this area is of relative and not absolute safety from a threat posed from within inside the vehicle.

- L. It is important to never walk or stand in between the stopped vehicle and the patrol vehicle.
 - 1. Driver can see you there, and injure you, back up, etc.
 - 2. Have the driver turn off the engine immediately after stopping!
 - a. Have driver remove keys from ignition if you suspect any crime other than traffic stop itself.
 - b. Take possession of keys as soon as practical as soon as you know you will take custody of driver.
- M. Steps to follow during the initial violator contact include:
 - Greeting/ID: "Good morning, sir, good evening, ma'am, etc., I am Officer Smith from the XYZ Department or I am Officer Smith from the 12th Precinct."
 - 2. **Reason for the stop**: State why the <u>vehicle</u> is stopped. Note the emphasis is on what the vehicle did, not the driver.
 - a. Some officers prefer to get custody of documents before discussing the reasons for the stop.
 - (1) If the person wants to argue, or leave, you have ID, a persuasive reason for them to stay.
 - (2) If the person insists on knowing before giving documents, offer them the reason for the stop.
 - (3) You never let motorist control the situation.
 - 3. **Any justified reason**: "Is there a reason that your vehicle did not stop for the red light?"
 - 4. **Drivers license**: Request license prior to asking for registration and insurance.
 - 5. **Registration & Insurance**: Ask where he/she keeps them prior to the request.
 - 6. **Return to police vehicle**: Explain your actions to the driver.

- 7. **Decision / Closing**: Explaining your decision or issuance of summons and how the motorist answers the summons if issued. Advise the motorist how you would like them to exit safely into traffic. The motorist should leave before the police vehicle. The closing should be courteous, "Thank you for your cooperation, and let me help you back into traffic."
- N. It is important to clearly relay the correct driver license number/registration to communications.
 - Items that an officer should check to be sure a license is valid include:
 - a. The restrictions on the front and/or back.
 - b. Whether the license has been laminated.
 - c. Compare license description to the offender.
 - d. The expiration date.
 - e. Alteration of recorded information, especially date of birth.
 - f. Compare photograph on license to the offender.
 - 2. Generally, have communications check the following through E-Justice (NCIC/DCJS/DMV).
 - 3. Driver's license (e.g. valid, expired, suspended, revoked, forged).
 - 4. Vehicle Registration (e.g. valid, expired, suspended, switched plates).
 - 5. Wants/Warrants vehicle; operator and/or occupants.
 - 6. Vehicle Insurance (e.g. in effect or not).
- O. It is important when giving a warning to explain to the offender the reason for the stop and precautions to observe in the future.
- P. Disadvantages/advantages of violators leaving their vehicles.
 - 1. Frequently, the violator will want to get out of the vehicle. Sometimes, from a standpoint of officer safety, the officer might want the violator out of the vehicle during the interview.

2. Discuss this situation – In terms of the disadvantages and advantages of the violator being out of the vehicle.

a. <u>Disadvantages</u>

- (1) Subjects the violator to the hazards of passing traffic.
- (2) Facilitates the potential for assault on the officer.
- (3) Hinders the officer's ability to examine the violators vehicle.

b. Advantages

- (1) May eliminate a hazardous element of the approach by directing the driver out of the vehicle to the curb while maintaining a position of safety.
- (2) The violator's action can constantly be observed especially hand movements. During the conduct, the violator is kept in the officer's field of vision (directly or peripherally).
- (3) If there are additional occupants in the vehicle, the officer can place the violator between the occupants and self. This may discourage an assault on the officer by the occupants.
- Q. Do not accept the violator's wallet.
 - 1. When violators are asked for their driver's licenses, sometimes they hand the officer their entire wallet or card holder.
 - To decrease the possibility of a violator complaining that money, credit cards, or other items were taken from a wallet, courteously ask the violator to remove the license and hand over the license only. Do not accept items such as insurance card holders or envelopes for this reason.
 - a. It may be desirable to explain the reasoning behind this practice.
 - b. It's also possible other things will come out with the license, and possibly blow away. It will only fall on the floor if the motorist removes it within the car.

III Specialized Vehicles

- A. Procedures that should be employed to safely stop and approach one or more motorcycles include:
 - 1. Be aware that a motorcycle pullover can be a problem because of maneuverability, speed and vulnerability of this form of transportation.
 - 2. Immediately note license plate number(s).
 - 3. Pull a motorcycle over in the same manner as any other vehicle.
 - 4. Do not follow too closely; a motorcycle can slide or slip, especially going onto a road shoulder.
 - 5. If there is more than one motorcyclist, stop them together.
 - 6. Request the driver(s) turn the motor off.
 - 7. Do not take eyes off the driver.
 - 8. Be aware that some motorcycle gangs are involved in organized criminal activity.
 - a. There may be a vehicle (often a van or truck) that follows criminal motorcycle gangs; they are "protection."
 - (1) Chances are, if there is such a vehicle, it will not interfere with you, unless the gang is currently wanted members, or recently involved in criminal activity.
 - (2) The follower can also be just a safety and repair vehicle, if it is clear they are connected, have them park in front of the motorcycles, and exit the vehicle, stand on the curb in your view.
 - (3) Have back-up!
- B. Procedures that should be employed to safely stop and approach a bus include:
 - 1. Be aware that the passengers are school children, public carrier riders or charter bus riders.

- 2. Apply the same basic pullover techniques.
- 3. Be sure the bus stops in a safe location.
- 4. Use caution exiting the patrol vehicle.
- 5. Cross over behind the patrol vehicle and approach the front bus door from the curb side.
- 6. Request the bus driver to set his brake, turn off the motor and exit the vehicle.
- 7. Notify communications to request a new bus driver, if arrested.
- 8. Stay with the bus until replacement driver arrives, if possible.
 - a. Children on a school bus should never be left unattended.
- C. Procedures that should be employed to safely stop and approach a semi-truck include:
 - 1. Be aware there may be a visibility problem due to the size of the truck.
 - 2. Apply the same basic pullover techniques.
 - 3. Be sure the truck stops in a safe location.
 - 4. Use caution exiting the patrol vehicle.
 - 5. Request driver to set his brake and turn off the motor.
 - 6. Instruct the driver to exit the vehicle.
 - 7. If arrest must be made, secure offender's vehicle.
- D. Procedures that should be employed to safely stop and approach a van or camper include:
 - 1. Be aware of any side doors, back doors or windows.
 - 2. Apply the same basic pullover techniques.
 - 3. Use caution exiting the patrol vehicle.

- 4. Approach the van or camper, staying close to the vehicle.
- 5. If suspicious, do not approach the vehicle, but instead use the PA system.
- 6. Compare photograph on license to the offender.
- IV Validity and Authenticity of Driver's License.
 - A. Introduction.
 - 1. The purpose of obtaining valid identification is to establish the identity of the individual. It is important to be familiar with acceptable forms of identification.
 - a. An objective of field interviewing is to detect deception on the part of individuals.
 - (1) The officer may be presented with false forms of identification.
 - (2) It only takes a little time to properly check out an item of identification.
 - 2. Officers must realize the importance of determining the validity of the information being presented.
 - Acceptable forms of identification.
 - 1. Driver's License.
 - a. One of the most common forms of identification.
 - b. Driver's license form varies depending on the state of issuance.
 - c. Officers should always check for possible restrictions (e.g., corrective lenses, restricted use, etc.)
 - (1) Restrictions are usually found on the front and rear of a license.
 - (2) License classification should also be verified.
 - d. In examining a license for alteration, the officer should

check for any modifications or additions to the license.

- (1) Common alterations include changing the date of birth and class of the license.
- (2) Over the past several years, numerous modifications have been made to the driver's license format. When any doubt exists, ask for supportive identification.
- e. Multiple licenses/driving records.
 - (1) People with suspended licenses or warrants sometimes use various identities or obtain multiple licenses (e.g., through a variation of name or DOB) to continue driving.
 - (2) If suspicions surface, it may be appropriate to have a "group search" of driver records conducted.
- f. NYS Driver's License security features (both 2008 and 2013 versions are valid)
 - (1) 2008 Issue document is laminated (laminate cannot be peeled)
 - i) Can be TraCS scanned.
 - ii) Utilizes microprint, UV image, and color blended background to make any alterations easily detectable
 - iii) Utilizes a scanned color photograph and signature
 - iv) Includes "1-D and "2-D" barcodes on back
 - v) Document is flexible and can be folded without creasing.
 - vi) Includes a magnetic "swipe strip" on the back.
 - vii) Uses a 9-digit code assigned by DMV (Client ID).

- viii) Has other security features, consult with a document fraud training manual.
- (2) 2013 Issue Document is made with a PolyCarbon Material (not laminated)
 - i) The Client ID, issue date, expiration date and signature are laser etched which results in a raised "tactile" feel on the card and cannot be altered without destroying the document.
 - ii) Can be TraCS scanned.
 - iii) Utilizes microprint, UV image, and color blended background to make any alterations easily detectable
 - iv) 2013 Issue Utilizes a "Greyscale" Laser Printed photograph as well as a smaller laser
 - v) Is flexible, but cannot be folded
 - vi) Includes "1-D and "2-D" barcodes on back
 - vii) Uses a 9-digit code assigned by DMV (Client ID).
 - viii) Has other security features, (consult with a document fraud training manual).
- 2. Immigration identification.
 - a. Aliens may have in their possession an alien registration card which contains the bearer's photograph and other information. Information on the card may be out of date and should be verified with additional forms of identification.
- State identification card.
 - a. The State of New York may issue an identification card to use as official identification.
 - b. The card is issued through DMV.
 - c. It has a similar appearance to the Driver's License but will

indicate "Non-Driver ID" on the top of the document.

- 4. Social Security card.
 - a. It can be unreliable form of identification
 - (1) Can be obtained by just applying for it
 - (a) Some criminal have applied for dozens of them
 - (b) Check passers will use different ones to back up phony identification that they carry
- 5. Armed forces identification classification and identification status:
 - a. Green active duty
 - b. Red reserve
 - c. Colors vary retired
 - d. Tan dependents
- 6. Passports
- 7. School identification cards
- 8. Others
- C. Verify validity of driver's license, vehicle registration and insurance via NYSPIN (DMV)
 - 1. Driver's License
 - a. Valid
 - b. Expired
 - c. Suspended
 - d. Revoked
 - e. Multiple (e.g., by using variations of name and/or DOB)
 - f. Convictions

- 2. Registration
 - a. Valid
 - b. Expired
 - c. Suspended
 - d. Switched plates
- Insurance
 - a. Valid
 - b. Canceled
- 4. NCIC/DCJS
 - a. Wants/warrants automatically searched
- 5. The instructor should review local methods or databases that may be acceptable for verifying the identity of a person who cannot present a valid form of identification.
- D. International Driver's License.
 - 1. There is no "international driver's license."
 - a. There are International Driver's Permits (IDP).
 - b. According to the Federal Trade Commission (FTC), authentic IDPs, which are available in the U.S. from only two authorized agencies, American Automobile Association (AAA) and American Automobile Touring Alliance (AATA), have a very limited use and purpose.
 - (1) http://www.aaa.com/vacation/idpf.html
 - (2) http://www.nacroadservice.com/international-driving-permit
 - c. Legitimate IDPs which are issued pursuant to the United Nations Road Traffic Convention of 1949, assist a person with a valid driver's license to drive in foreign countries that have also signed the Convention. Notably, and IDP

is not a substitute for a government-issued driver's license; rather it is simply a booklet that translates that government-issued driver's license into a number of difference languages.

- d. IDPs merely serve as a translation document for a government-issued driver's license, and they have no value independent of such government-issued licenses. IDPs do not protect their holders from traffic enforcement of from "points" and cannot be used in place of suspended or revoked license, or as identification in lieu of a government-issued document.
- 2. An international driver's permit must be obtained from one of the aforementioned organizations (AAA, AATA)
 - a. Permit only verifies they hold a valid license in their home country.
 - b. It is their foreign driver's license that allows them to drive in the United States.
 - c. If they do not have a driver's license and other suitable documents from their home country, they are driving without a license here.
 - d. The United States does NOT issue international driver's licenses to foreign visitors.
- V Completing a Simplified Traffic Information.

Instructor Note: First discuss proper completion of a Simplified Traffic
Information based upon the information which follows. Thereafter, a practical
exercise must be conducted. Given a blank simplified traffic information and a
word picture depicting a traffic violation, students are required to properly
complete the form within a specified period of time.

The issuing officer should use a ball point pen and press hard when filling out the ticket (remember there are six copies and the last one is the Officer's Copy). Instructions for entering data in the blocks and boxes of the Uniform Traffic Ticket follow.

- A. Instructors should be using the training guides produced by the NYS DMV, found in the appendix. See appendix- Traffic Stops:
 - TSLED Booklet 2006.

- Officer Pocket Guide 2006.
- VI Vehicle Stops High Risk.
 - A. Verification of vehicle/suspect.
 - B. Notify dispatch.
 - 1. Direction of travel.
 - 2. Description of vehicle/suspect.
 - 3. Speed
 - C. Select location for stop
 - 1. Same as in low risk
 - 2. As little vehicle and pedestrian traffic as possible
 - 3. Not conducive to escape
 - 4. Wait for back-up if possible
 - D. Stopping vehicle/suspect
 - 1. Method of notifying: emergency lights and siren.
 - 2. Position of patrol vehicle
 - a. Forty-five degree offset vs. behind suspect vehicle
 - b. Exiting quickly from vehicle
 - c. Two patrol vehicle technique
 - 3. Use of cover and concealment
 - 4. Identify yourself
 - 5. Remove from vehicle
 - a. Voice commands.
 - (1) Loud and clear.

- (2) Issued by original stopping officer.
- b. All out driver's side.
- c. Hands on head.
- d. Have driver remove place keys on top of car or on the ground outside of the vehicle.
- 6. Place into cuff and search position
- 7. Restrain, search, transport
- 8. Concept that "time is on your side."
 - a. Wait for back-up
 - b. Do not rush
- IV. Vehicle Inventory.
 - A. "[N]ot a 'search' in the accepted legal sense but an inventory examination reasonably and properly conducted." *People v. Robinson*, 320 N.Y.S.2d 665, 670 (N.Y. App. Div. 2d Dept. 1971)
 - B. The only legitimate purposes for inventory searches are one following an established departmental policy.
 - 1. Get a copy of the policy.
 - 2. Do not inventory vehicles etc., unless you have a copy of the policy, and have reviewed it, and have copies of any referenced forms for use.
 - C. Inventories are conducted to:
 - 1. Protect the police from allegations of theft, etc.
 - 2. Protect the property of the accused.
 - 3. Protect the agency from false claims that valuables were stolen while vehicle was in custody of the police or the tow truck company, etc.

D. Inventories should:

- 1. Never allow much latitude on the officer's part to alter the procedure for inventory.
 - Department manual policies or S.O.P.s should establish a standardized procedure for such inventory.
 - Must result in a meaningful inventory list of items contained within the vehicle. [*People v. Gomez*, 912 N.E.2d 555, 557 (N.Y. 2009)]
 - d. Inventory results must be recorded in a useable format. [Id. at 559]
- Never be used for justification to search a car where evidence is expected to be recovered and in lieu of proper investigatory steps.
- E. Normally, if an operator is arrested (e.g. operator is suspended or revoked) or if a vehicle is impounded for other reasons (e.g. unsafe, no insurance in force), it must be inventoried and secured in strict accordance with employing agency policies and procedures.
 - 1. For purposes of officer safety, searching and inventorying the contents of a vehicle should never be done prior to having the operator in custody and all other occupants away from the area.
 - a. Often, the inventory is done at the location where the vehicle is impounded.
 - b. Inventorying should always be done promptly after the vehicle and/or operator has been taken into custody.
 - 2. It is very important that all required forms are completed properly and that any contraband is handled in accordance with agency procedures relating to evidence handling.
 - 3. Authority to conduct inventory searches of automobiles is discussed in the unit entitled "Criminal Procedure Law" (Part 3-C).
 - 4. Policies should be strictly followed, and a receipt for property secured issued. Most policy has you attempt to get a signature of the owner on the receipt (even if contraband or evidence is obtained).

VII Practical exercises

- A. Completion of a Simplified Traffic Information.
 - 1. Recruit officers should be required to complete at least one Simplified Traffic Information/UTT.
 - 2. This can be conducted within the classroom, as part of the mock stops, or both.
 - 3. Progressive complexity is important here. Don't overwhelm the student at the expense of the learning process!
- B. Students are required to participate in at least 2 mock traffic stop exercises to demonstrate practical application of the material covered during this section. Suggested scenarios include:
 - 1. Stopping a vehicle for a traffic violation, interacting with the operator, and issuing a UTT for the violation.
 - 2. Stopping a vehicle for suspected criminal activity and taking the required action based on available information.
 - Reality Based Training Instructors should be utilized for force-onforce scenarios.
- C. Considerations should include:
 - 1. Radio communications
 - a. Communicating the location of the stop
 - b. License, registration, warrants, etc.
 - 2. Proper utilization of emergency equipment
 - 3. Vehicle approach
 - 4. Interaction with the operator
 - 5. Issuing UTT/Arrest procedures

New York State FFY 2025 Section 405(i) Driver and Officer Safety Education Grant Application

Introduction

New York State (NYS) is applying for Section 405(i) funds as a Qualifying State under CFR Section 1300.28(d)(2) (Peace Officer Training Program), to help fund its effort to make significant revisions to the Vehicle Stop Training Module curriculum in its Basic Course for Police Officers and provide subsequent training opportunities to active law enforcement reenforcing their roles and responsibilities during traffic stops, using the most recent court decisions and legal updates. The State is endeavoring to create a fully contextualized training involving live, in person, real world traffic stop scenarios. This grant would provide the necessary funds to: 1. Expand/update current traffic stop scenarios utilized in the Basic Training Course, making sure to focus on best practices for civilians and peace officers during traffic stops to ensure procedural justice, 2. Provide needed equipment to make the simulation as real as possible, and 3. Ultimately make the updated real world scenario training, incorporating the most recent court decisions/current law available to all law enforcement. This will properly prepare recruits for when they encounter civilians on the job and accurately document such encounters as well as provide a reminder to active LE members. The following sections provide documentation demonstrating that New York meets the eligibility criteria to apply for a Section 405 (i) Driver and Officer Safety Education grant for FFY 2025 as a Qualifying State.

Basic Course for Police Officers in NYS Vehicle Stop Training Module

To meet the criteria to qualify for funding under Section 405(i) Driver and Officer Safety Education Grants, states must demonstrate that the instruction and testing regarding the proper interaction with civilians during traffic stops provided to law enforcement, utilize appropriate industry standards as established through the Municipal Police Training Council (MPTC). As evidence of NYS's qualifications, below outlines the current peace officer training program required for employment as a peace officer throughout the State:

- Current section outline for 4-I of the Basic Course for Police Officers (BCPO), Vehicle Stops and Traffic Enforcement, covers the following topics:
 - o Traffic enforcement;
 - The relationship between selective enforcement and community-oriented policing;
 - o Actions a law enforcement officer may take in response to a traffic violation;
 - Proper procedures for interacting with stopped motorists;
 - Ascertaining the validity of documents presented during the stop;
 - Properly completing a simplified traffic information (ticket);
 - Recognizing when a custodial arrest is authorized;
 - o Proper procedures in effecting the stop of a motor-vehicle.

NYS's program currently meets MPTC's requirements, however, there is a vast difference in the robustness of the training from academy to academy due to differences in level of available resources. Currently there are approximately 35 police academies (not including the NYSP) in NYS. All the police academies are required to provide training regarding proper vehicle stops and include a "practical exercise". But not all academies conduct "real world scenarios" due to lack of resources. NYS is looking

to make significant revisions to the Vehicle Stop Training Module to create a fully contextualized training for <u>all</u> police academies, and ultimately have post-academy in-service training available to all law enforcement agencies that incorporates the most up-to-date case law regarding citizen encounters. Evidence that the State has taken meaningful steps regarding meeting this goal and its plans for reaching full compliance in the future is provided in the information below.

Actions/Meaningful Steps Already Taken or Underway

Currently, police recruits in New York State receive a minimum of 11 hours of instruction on the procedures related to stopping motorists for traffic offenses. Although each recruit is required to complete one traffic stop scenario prior to graduation from the academy, the instruction on this topic is largely conducted in a classroom setting using a lecture-based presentation. Attached is a copy of Module 4 of the Basic Course for Police Officers regarding Vehicle Stops and Traffic Enforcement. In nearly all cases, the traffic stop scenario that must be completed is conducted later in the academy resulting in the scenario being temporally disconnected from the instruction.

Academies in New York vary in their structure. Some academies train only - or mostly – recruits that will go on to work within that agency. Academies such as the New York City Police Department, New York State Police, and the Nassau County Police Academy fit this description. However, most academies in the state are regional in nature and some are pre-employment academies that are affiliated with educational institutions rather than police departments. In these academies, recruits are either employed by an agency that is utilizing that academy for recruit training or recruits that are obtaining the bulk of their training before attempting to find employment as a police officer.

Regional and pre-employment academies often lack the resources of the larger police academies. The resources that are available are often borrowed from police departments who are participating in the academy resulting in substandard equipment or a lack of appropriate equipment to train with. For the pre-employment academies that are not affiliated with a department, there is often no equipment or resources to conduct contextually relevant training on traffic stops.

Nearly all police departments in NYS utilize a software program called TraCS (Traffic and Criminal Software) for the issuance of traffic tickets, completion of crash reports, and inventorying of impounded vehicles. Some departments also use TraCS for additional duties such as preparing accusatory instruments for criminal offenses. However, when officers practice these tasks in the police academies, they are often using paper versions of these reports or simply viewing completed reports that have been prepared using TraCS.

It has been well established that contextually relevant instruction is important for retention and the application of the learned material. Significant efforts have been made to contextualize the learning environments for police recruits; however, these methods are often much more resource intensive than traditional classroom lectures. These improved methods require more instructors and more equipment than many academies have. This initiative seeks to address those resource deficiencies and improve the instruction by providing academies with the equipment that officers will use upon graduation.

In addition to this method of delivery improving the learning outcomes, it will allow for police recruits to receive instruction and get practice interacting with motorists in a procedurally just way. Procedural justice is a hallmark of the recruit training program that emphasizes neutrality in decision-making and respectful treatment of citizens during interactions and facilitates discussions of bias in decision-making,

including implicit bias related to race, ethnicity, or other characteristics. In many communities, motor vehicle stops are the primary way that police officers interact with members of the community and vice versa. Revising the curriculum with a focus on these real-world interactions will allow for instructors to ensure recruits fully understand and can apply the concepts of procedural justice during stops and become mindful of implicit bias concerns, as well as act as a much-needed reminder to active law enforcement members when used during in-service trainings.

The GTSC is working with DCJS (Division of Criminal Justice Services) to revise the curriculum of Vehicle Stop Training Module in the current Basic Course for Police Officers in NYS by creating fully contextualized training involving live, in person, real world traffic stop scenarios. This work will also be informed by the recent revisions expected to be adopted to the BCPO (Basic Course for Police Officers) section on Professional Communications.

- 3. The Recipient will insert the clauses of appendix A and E of this Assurance (also referred to as DOT Order 1050.2A) [1] in every contract or agreement subject to the Acts and the Regulations.
- 4. The Recipient will insert the clauses of appendix B of DOT Order 1050.2A, as a covenant running with the land, in any deed from the United States effecting or recording a transfer of real property, structures, use, or improvements thereon or interest therein to a Recipient.

As part of a comprehensive program, the State will support a data-based traffic safety enforcement program that fosters effective community collaboration to increase public safety, and data collection and analysis to ensure transparency, identify disparities in traffic enforcement, and inform traffic enforcement policies, procedures, and activities. (23 U.S.C. 402(b)(1)(E))
- 6. The State will implement activities in support of national highway safety goals to reduce motor vehicle related fatalities that also reflect the primary data-related crash factors within the State, as identified by the State highway safety planning process, including:

- Participation in the National high-visibility law enforcement mobilizations as identified annually in the NHTSA Communications Calendar, including not less than 3 mobilization campaigns in each fiscal year to
 - o Reduce alcohol-impaired or drug-impaired operation of motor vehicles;
 - o Increase use of seat belts by occupants of motor vehicles;
- Sustained enforcement of statutes addressing impaired driving, occupant protection, and driving in excess of posted speed limits;
- An annual statewide seat belt use survey in accordance with 23 CFR part 1340 for the measurement of State seat belt use rates, except for the Secretary of Interior on behalf of Indian tribes;
- Development of statewide data systems to provide timely and effective data analysis to support allocation of highway safety resources;
- Coordination of triennial Highway Safety Plan, data collection, and information systems with the State strategic highway safety plan, as defined in 23 U.S.C. 148(a); and
- Participation in the Fatality Analysis Reporting System (FARS), except for American Samoa, Guam, the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, or the United States Virgin Islands
- 7. The State will actively encourage all relevant law enforcement agencies in the State to follow the guidelines established for vehicular pursuits issued by the International Association of Chiefs of Police that are currently in effect. (23 U.S.C. 402(j))
- 8. The State will not expend Section 402 funds to carry out a program to purchase, operate, or maintain an automated traffic enforcement system, except in a work zone or school zone. (23 U.S.C. 402(c)(4))
